Asclepias asperula (J. Decaisne) R. Woodson

Green-Flowered Milkweed

(*Asclepias capricornu*, *Asclepias decumbens*, *Ascerates decumbens*, *Asclepiodora decumbens*)

- C This interesting perennial wildflower occurs in dry rocky soils in Northeast and Central Texas; it has tight 30 to 40 arched hemispherical clusters of light green five-petaled star-shaped flowers separated by five pinstriped white stamens tipped in white ball-shaped anthers; blooms occur from spring to late summer; leaves are 4 to 8 long, narrow, and strap-like to lanceolate.
- C Although not usually grown in cultivated gardens, this species is an interesting addition to wildflower plantings and regional native gardens.
