

Insert as an Additional Taxa For *Cyrtomium falcatum*.

Athyrium filix-femina (L.) A. Roth var. ***asplenioides*** (A. Michaux) O. Farwell **Southern Lady Fern**
(*Athyrium asplenioides*, *Athyrium filix-femina* subsp. *asplenioides*)

- C Also known as Lady Fern or River Fern; this Eastern US native can be found in the wild as far west as Texas and Oklahoma; fronds of this, 2Nto 3N(4N) tall, fern are very delicate and lacy adding a soft fragile texture to landscapes; plants do not spread rapidly and combine well with other perennials or shrubs.
- C This taxa is useful in at least USDA zones 6 through 9; plants should be grown in filtered shade with a constantly moist high organic matter soil; Southern Lady Fern can tolerate less than perfect drainage and a variety of soil pHs; best growth is eastern portions of our region.
